The Okaloosa County Board of County Commissioners under the provisions of Section 287.055, Florida Statutes and County policy, request qualifications from agencies for **Developing and Printing the Emerald Coast Visitor's Guide.**

Agencies desiring consideration should provide an original and six (6) copies of their Request for Qualifications (RFQ) with the agency's areas of expertise identified. Submissions should be portrait orientation, unbound, and 8 ½" x 11" where practical. Guidelines detailing form and content requirements for the statement of qualifications are available by contacting Okaloosa County Purchasing Department, 602-C North Pearl St., Crestview, FL 32536, 850-689-5960, or download them from our website at http://www.co.okaloosa.fl.us/dept_purchasing.html.

Submittals must be delivered to the Okaloosa County Purchasing Department at the address below no later than 4:00 p.m., May 30, 2014 in order to be considered. All submittals received after the stated time and date will be returned unopened and will not be considered. NOTE: Crestview, FL is not a next day guaranteed delivery location by most delivery services. Proposers using mail or delivery services assume all risks of late or non-delivery.

All submittals must be in sealed envelopes reflecting on the outside thereof "Developing and Printing the Emerald Coast Visitor's Guide." Failure to mark outside of envelope as set forth herein shall result in the submittal not being considered.

The County reserves the right to award to the firm submitting a responsive proposal with a resulting negotiated agreement that is most advantageous and in the best interest of Okaloosa County, and to waive any irregularity or technicality in proposals received. Okaloosa County shall be the sole judge of the proposal and the resulting negotiating agreement that is in its best interest and its decision will be final.

Florida's Emerald Coast 2014-2015 Visitor's Guide

The Tourist Development Department is issuing an RFQ associated with developing and printing the 2014-2015 Emerald Coast Visitors Guide. The size of the guide is 8.375 x 10.875 with a minimum 76+4 page count. Advertisements should number no more than 25 ad pages and include a gloss spot UV cover (with the exception of the back cover address block), with body text paper stock point/pound specified. Annual production falls between 75K and 100K copies each. The guide will be distributed from 09/30/14 – 12/01/15.

Vendor to demonstrate proficiency in the following:

- Development of all copy, listings and designs
 - o Agency to provide design guidelines to fit within current brand
- Verification and proofing of all content and listings, providing Excel grid content for each section to the ECVB for approval at least 3 weeks prior to print
- Production of the guide
- Guide to meet all current postal code requirements with NO back cover address block UV gloss spot coating
- Provide quick loading 2-page spread interactive flipbook for consumers to view online
- Provide motion graphics for front cover of online flipbook
- Deliver guide to TDD by 09/30/2014
- Vendor to exclusively sell and collect all advertisement revenue
 - o ECVB to approve all visitors guide sales materials and rates
 - o All ads must be formatted by vendor and approved by ECVB and Visit Florida
 - o ECVB to have final approval of all ad sales
 - All ad sales are restricted to Okaloosa County, unless pre-approved by the ECVB in writing
- Any costs associated with vendor photography requires ECVB pre-approval
- Vender will store the guides in boxes not exceeding 30 pounds each on non-stacked pallets accessible without a forklift in an easily accessible, climate-controlled, secure local facility approved by the ECVB
- ECVB to pay freight delivery costs direct from printer to each Visit Florida Welcome Center as specified by Visit Florida

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

1. Right to Waive and Reject:

- A. The Board, in its absolute discretion, may reject any proposal of a proposer that has failed, in the opinion of the Board, to complete or perform an Okaloosa County contracted project in a timely fashion or has failed in any other way, in the opinion of the Board, to perform a prior contract in a satisfactory manner, and has directed the Okaloosa County Purchasing Manager to emphasize this condition to potential proposers.
- B. There is no obligation on the part of the County to award the proposal to the lowest proposer, and the County reserves the right to award the proposal to proposer submitting a responsive proposal with a resulting negotiated agreement which is most advantageous and in the best interest of Okaloosa county, and to reject any and all proposals or to waive any irregularity or technicality in proposals received. Okaloosa County shall be the sole judge of the proposal and the resulting negotiated agreement that is in its best interest and its decision shall be final.
- C. The Board of County Commissioners reserves the right to waive any informalities or reject any and all proposals, in whole or part, to utilize any applicable state contracts in lieu of or in addition to this proposal and to accept the proposal that in its judgment will best serve the interest of the County.
- D. The Board of County Commissioners specifically reserves the right to reject any conditional proposal and will normally reject those which made it impossible to determine the true amount of the proposal.

2. Disqualification of Proposers:

Any of the following reasons may be considered as sufficient for the disqualification of a proposer and the rejection of his proposal or proposals:

- A. More than one proposal for the same work from an individual, firm or corporation under the same or different name.
- B. Evidence that the proposer has a financial interest in the firm of another proposer for the same work.
- C. Evidence of collusion among proposers. Participants in such collusion will receive no recognition as proposers for any future work of the County until such participant shall have been reinstated as a qualified proposer.

- D. Uncompleted work which in the judgment of the County might hinder or prevent the prompt completion of additional work if awarded.
- E. Failure to pay or satisfactorily settle all bills due for labor and material on former contracts in force at the time of advertisement of proposals.
- F. Default under previous contract.
- G. The Board, in its absolute discretion, may reject any proposal of a proposer that has failed, in the opinion of the Board, to complete or perform an Okaloosa County contracted project in a timely fashion or has failed in any other way, in the opinion of the Board, to perform a prior contract in a satisfactory manner, and has directed the Okaloosa County Purchasing Manager to emphasize this condition to potential proposers.
- 3. **Discrimination:** An entity or affiliate who has been placed on the discriminatory vendor list may not submit a bid on a contract to provide goods or services to a public entity, may not submit a bid on a contract with a public entity for the construction or repair of a public building or public work, may not submit bids on leases of real property to a public entity, may not award or perform work as a contractor, supplier, subcontractor, or consultant under contract with any public entity, and may not transact business with any public entity.
- 4. Indemnification & Hold Harmless: To the fullest extent permitted by law, CONTRACTOR shall indemnify and hold harmless COUNTY, its officers and employees from liabilities, damages, losses, and costs including but not limited to reasonable attorney fees, to the extent caused by the negligence, recklessness, or intentional wrongful conduct of the CONTRACTOR and other persons employed or utilized by the CONTRACTOR in the performance of this Agreement.
- bidders <u>only</u> when bids are received from firms located in states, counties, municipalities or other political subdivisions which offer preference to bidders located in such political subdivisions. The amount of preference given to local bidders will be the same as that given by the state, county, municipality or other political subdivisions in which a bidder is located. If the political subdivision in which a bidder is located offers a preference to its local firms, that bidder must plainly state the extent of such preference to include the amount and type preference offers. Any bidder failing to indicate such preference will be removed from the County bid list and any and all bids from that firm will be rejected.

Note: For proposer's convenience, this certification form is enclosed and is made a part of the bid package.

Reorganization or Bankruptcy Proceedings: Proposals will not be considered from vendors who are currently involved in official financial reorganization or bankruptcy proceedings.

- **Payments:** The contractor shall be paid upon submission of invoices in duplicate to the Okaloosa County Board of County Commissioners, Finance Office, 302 N. Wilson St, #203, Crestview FL 32536.
- **8. Information:** Questions concerning proposal requirements or specifications should be directed to Okaloosa County Purchasing, 602-C North Pearl St., Crestview, FL 32536, 850-689-5960, or http://www.co.okaloosa.fl.us/dept_purchasing.html. Any changes by the County to specifications shall be in writing in the form of an addendum and furnished to all proposers. Verbal information obtained otherwise will not be considered in awarding bids.
- 9. Public Entity Crime Information: A person or affiliate who has been placed on the convicted vendor list following a conviction for a public entity crime may not submit a bid on a contract to provide any goods or services to a public entity, may not submit a bid on a contract with a public entity for the construction or repair of a public building or public work, may not submit bids on leases of real property to a public entity, may not be awarded or perform work as a contractor, supplier, subcontractor, or consultant under a contract with any public entity, and may not transact business with any public entity in excess of the threshold amount provided in Section 287.017, for CATEGORY TWO for a period of 36 months from the date of being placed on the convicted vendor list.
- 10. Conflict of Interest Disclosure Form: The award hereunder is subject to the provisions of Chapter 112, Florida Statutes. All respondents must disclose with their proposals the name of any officer, director, or agent who is also a public officer or an employee of the Okaloosa County Board of County Commissioners, or any of its agencies.

Furthermore, all respondents must disclose the name of any County officer or employee who owns, directly or indirectly, an interest of five percent (5%) or more in the firm or any of its branches.

Furthermore, the official, prior to or at the time of submission of the proposal, must file a statement with the Clerk of Circuit Court of Okaloosa County, if he is an officer or employee of the County, disclosing his or spouse's or child's interest and the nature of the intended business.

Note: For proposer's convenience, this certification form is enclosed and is made a part of the bid package.

11. Identical Tie Bids: Preference shall be given to businesses with drug-free workplace programs. Whenever two or more bids which are equal with respect to price, quality and service are received by the County for the procurement of commodities or contractual services, a bid received from a business that certifies that it has implemented a drug-free workplace program shall be given preference in the award process (see attached certification form).

Established procedures for processing tie bids will be followed if none of the tied vendors have a drug-free workplace program.

Note: For bidder's convenience, this certification form is enclosed and is made a part of the bid package.

12. Protection of Resident Workers: - The Okaloosa County Board of County Commissioners actively supports the Immigration & Nationality Act (INA) which includes employment eligibility, employment provisions addressing verification. nondiscrimination. Under the INA, employers may hire only persons who may legally work in the United States, (i.e., citizens and nationals of the U.S.) and aliens authorized to work in the U.S. The employer must verify the identity and employment eligibility of anyone to be hired, which includes completing the Employment Eligibility Verification. The contractor shall establish appropriate procedures and controls so no services or products under the contract documents will be performed or manufactured by any worker who is not legally eligible to perform such services or employment. Okaloosa County reserves the right to request documentation showing compliance with the requirement.

NO CONTACT CLAUSE

The Board of County Commissioners have established a solicitation silence policy (**No Contact Clause**) that prohibits oral and written communication regarding all formal solicitations for goods and services (formal bids, Request for Proposals, Requests for Qualifications) issued by the Board through the County Purchasing Department.

The period commences when the procurement document is received and terminates when the Board of County Commissioners approves an award.

When the solicitation silence period is in effect, no oral or written communication is allowed regarding the solicitation between prospective bidders/proposers and members of the Board of County Commissioners the County Administrator or members of the Board Approved Review Committee. All questions or requests for information regarding the solicitation <u>must</u> be directed to the designated Purchasing Representative listed in the solicitation.

Any information thought to affect the committee or staff recommendation submitted after bids are due, should be directed to the Purchasing Manager or an appointed representative. It shall be the Purchasing Manager decision whether to consider this information in the decision process.

Any <u>violation of this policy shall be grounds to disqualify the proposer from consideration</u> during the selection process.

All proposers must agree to comply with this policy by signing the following statement and including it with their submittal.

DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE CERTIFICATION
