Surtax Success Story:

We have exceeded our goal of paving 50 miles of dirt roads in 5 years thanks to the voter-approved infrastructure surtax. Okaloosa County will have stabilized approximately 150 miles of dirt roads in about 4 years. These improvements could not have happened without the wisdom of the voters of Okaloosa County who recognized the importance of having quality road infrastructure that will improve driving conditions and reduce harmful stormwater runoff. Hatched and happy



The Destin-Fort Walton Beach Sea Turtle Patrol with the County's Tourism Development Department monitored the hatching of the first nest of the season. The nest yielded 73 Kemp's ridley hatchlings that made their way into the Gulf of Mexico to start their new journey.

The nest hatched in the early hours of the morning and surveyors were able to be there while the hatchlings crawled out of the nest and to the water. All of the hatchlings went straight for the water and swam off strongly.

The team evaluated the nest 72 hours later by pulling out all of the eggs and counting the number of hatched eggs. In the nest, 73 out of 77 eggs hatched, resulting in a 95% successful hatch.
