May 2 Board Meeting Quick Notes

- Board voted to "table" the issue of a dredging policy related to Lake Vivian Channel.
- Board approved funding for a larger vessel to the Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office Marine unit using TDD funds.
- Board approved budget transfer from the surtax reserve for construction costs for County Road 2 and bridge repairs.
- Commissioner Ponder updated the Board on the progress from the legislative delegation related to possible appropriations that may be coming to Okaloosa County.

May 16 Board Meeting Quick Notes

- Board designated May 21-27 as Emergency Medical Services Week.
- Board voted to "table" approval of Airport Minimum Standards for Bob Sikes Airport and Destin Executive Airport.
- Board approved proposed two-unit apartment with a restaurant (Beachview) for parcel on west end of Okaloosa Island.
- Board approved moving forward with grant proposal for Shoal River Ranch WRF in amount of \$10 million.
