Okaloosa County Seeks Applicants Interested in Serving on the Board of Trustees, Okaloosa County Law Library - Applications Due by July 24, 2025

Okaloosa County Board of County Commissioners ("BCC") will appoint one who is a licensed private practice attorney to the Board of Trustees, Okaloosa County Law Library. The Okaloosa County Law Library was created in 1967 by a Special Act of the Florida Legislature (Ch. 67-1787 Laws of Florida). It is governed by a Board of Directors comprised of judges, elected officials and practicing attorneys. Per Laws of Florida, Ch. 67- 1787(1), as amended by Ch. 89-416(1). The "Board of Trustees, Okaloosa County Law Library," operates and maintains a law library in Okaloosa County; prescribing rules and regulations as to its function, organization, use, maintenance and operation. The appointee will serve a **two-year term**, which may begin immediately upon appointment.

The minimum requirements for this appointment are outlined in Laws of Florida, Ch. 67- 1787(1), as amended by Ch. 89-416(1), and by BCC policy. The County is soliciting applications from practicing attorneys of Okaloosa County.
