DEPARTMENT/PROGRAM: LIBRARY COOPERATIVE

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION: The Okaloosa County Public Library Cooperative is an independent intergovernmental agency governed by a board of seven appointed members. It is a partnership between the cities of Crestview, Destin, Fort Walton Beach, Niceville, Mary Esther, Valparaiso and Okaloosa County to provide library services for all county residents.

REVENUE: The Library Cooperative is funded within the General Fund. Supporting revenue of the General Fund are ad valorem taxes, communications service tax, local business tax, permits and fees, state shared revenue, charges for services, judgments and fines, miscellaneous revenue and transfers from other funds. Anticipated Board support funding for Fiscal Year 2014 is \$565,481.

MAJOR ACCOMPLISHMENTS LAST YEAR:

- Received \$36,978 LSTA grant; installed the Panhandle's first 24/7 library lending machine in Baker.
- Partnered with AARP to provide free income tax preparation to 2,287 low-to-moderate income residents.
- Received \$2,000 scholarship to bring in nationally-renowned trainer for library staff continuing education.
- ➤ Increased attendance at library programs by 42% from previous year.
- Expanded digital library service to achieve over 6300 downloads by 969 unique users in less than 1 year.
- ➤ Relinquished cost obligation of bookmobile facility, vehicle and inventory; returned over \$5600 to budget.
- Functioned as lead organization in partnerships with Chambers, County, School District, TDD, private industry and museums for Viva Florida 500 activities and time capsule; promoted Okaloosa quality of life.

PROGRAM GOAL:

The Okaloosa County Public Library Cooperative (OCPLC) provides convenient, free access to information, ideas, books and technology that enriches, educates and empowers the residents of Okaloosa County. Our libraries will foster the spirit of exploration, the joy of reading, and the pursuit of knowledge for all ages and cultures. It will offer individual enlightenment in every aspect of information and technology in a welcoming environment that provides challenge, collaboration and entertainment through proactive service that exceeds customer expectations.

KEY OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Coordinate library service among members to ensure high quality & equitable access throughout the county.
- 2. Provide resources to meet diverse informational, recreational, educational, and cultural needs.
- 3. Develop print and technology literacy in residents of all ages, beginning with the very young.
- 4. Encourage economic growth and enhance development of a skilled, ready workforce through programs, services and materials that address needs of job seekers and area businesses.
- 5. Support educational endeavors with study areas, computers, wireless Internet and supplemental resources.
- 6. Accommodate the increase in service population due to county growth and the libraries' absorption of the military community due to Eglin library closure.
