

Permit Guide for Decks

This guide provides the basic information necessary to enable the completion of a Building Permit Application for a deck.

- 1. Decks below 30 inches with no roof, will not need a building permit.
- 2. Decks 30 to 60 inches will need a building permit, but engineered plans will not be required.
- 3. Decks will need handrails, guardrails and steps. A site inspection will determine compliance.

Submittal Requirements Checklist for Decks:

1	Proof of property ownership. This can be a recorded deed, closing statement, or property
	tax information.
2	Two sets of construction plans are required when a deck is over 60 inches above grade.
	These construction plans must be certified, signed and sealed by a Florida registered design
	professional (Architect or Engineer).
3	Building Permit Application. The application must be fully completed, signed, and
	notarized.
4	Three (3) copies of a certified survey or site plan.

NOTE: You may be required to submit a certified Foundation Survey prepared by a Florida registered land surveyor prior to any vertical construction. Some circumstances may require additional information to be submitted prior to a development permit being issued.
